GENERAL INFORMATION

PASSPORT AND VISA

All foreign visitors desiring to enter Japan must have a valid passport. Visas are not required for tourists who are citizens (not merely residents) of the following countries:

ARGENTINA, AUSTRIA, BAHAMAS, BANGLADESH, BARBADOS, BELGIUM, CANADA, CHILE, COLOMBIA, COSTA RICA, CYPRUS, DENMARK, DOMINICAN REPUBLIC, EL SALVADOR, FINLAND, FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY, FRANCE, GREECE, GUATEMALA, HONDURAS, ICELAND, IRAN, IRELAND, ISRAEL, ITALY, LESOTHO, LIECHTENSTEIN, LUXEMBOURG, MALAYSIA, MALTA, MAURITIUS, MEXICO, NETHERLANDS, NEW ZEALAND, NORWAY, PAKISTAN, PERU, PORTUGAL, SAN MARINO, SINGAPORE, SPAIN, SURINAME, SWEDEN, SWITZERLAND, TUNISIA, TURKEY, UNITED KINGDOM, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, URUGUAY and YUGOSLAVIA.

Participants from other countries should apply for a visa to a Japanese Consulate or diplomatic mission in their country. For details, please consult your travel agent or the nearest Japanese mission.

Note: JTB would like to remind participants residing as foreigners in other countries that their visa requirements are based on the country of which they are citizens, not the nation in which they are currently residing. It is the responsibility of participants to obtain all necessary documents for entry into Japan. It is advisable to contact carries or travel agent for details.

CUSTOMS

Japanese Customs is fairly lenient and allows you to bring in necessary items for your personal use. Duty-free imports are: liquor (3 bottles); cigarettes (200) or cigars (100); perfume (2 ounces); 2 watches (each valued less than ¥30,000). Strictly prohibited are firearms and other types of weapons, and narcotics.

CURRENCY EXCHANGE

Only Japanese yen (¥) is acceptable at regular stores and restaurants. Certain foreign currencies and credit cards may be accepted at the limited number of hotels, restaurants and souvenir shops. You can buy yen at foreign exchange banks and other authorized money exchangers on presentation of your passport. The exchange rate fluctuates daily but the U.S. dollar equaled around ¥142 in October 1989.

TRAVELLER'S CHECKS AND CREDIT CARDS

Traveller's checks are accepted only by leading banks and major hotels in major cities, and you should be aware that using traveller's checks in Japan is not as popular as in some other countries.

Diners Club, American Express, Visa, and Master Card are widely accepted at hotels, department stores, shops, restaurants, and nightclubs as well as by major transportation systems. Other international credit cards have not been introduced to Japan as yet.

*Credit cards and traveller's checks are not acceptable at ARCADIA ICHIGAYA (SHIGAKU KAIKAN).

TIPPING

Tipping is a problem almost everywhere in the world. But in Japan you are free from this because tipping is not so common in Oriental countries except when asking for special service.

ELECTRIC CURRENT

The electric current in use throughout Japan is 100V; however, there are regional differences in the cycles: 50 cycles is used in eastern Japan including Tokyo and Yokohama; and 60 in Western Japan, including Kyoto and Osaka. In hotels, though, you may find two sockets for 110 and 220 V each, or a converter may be available through the housekeeper.

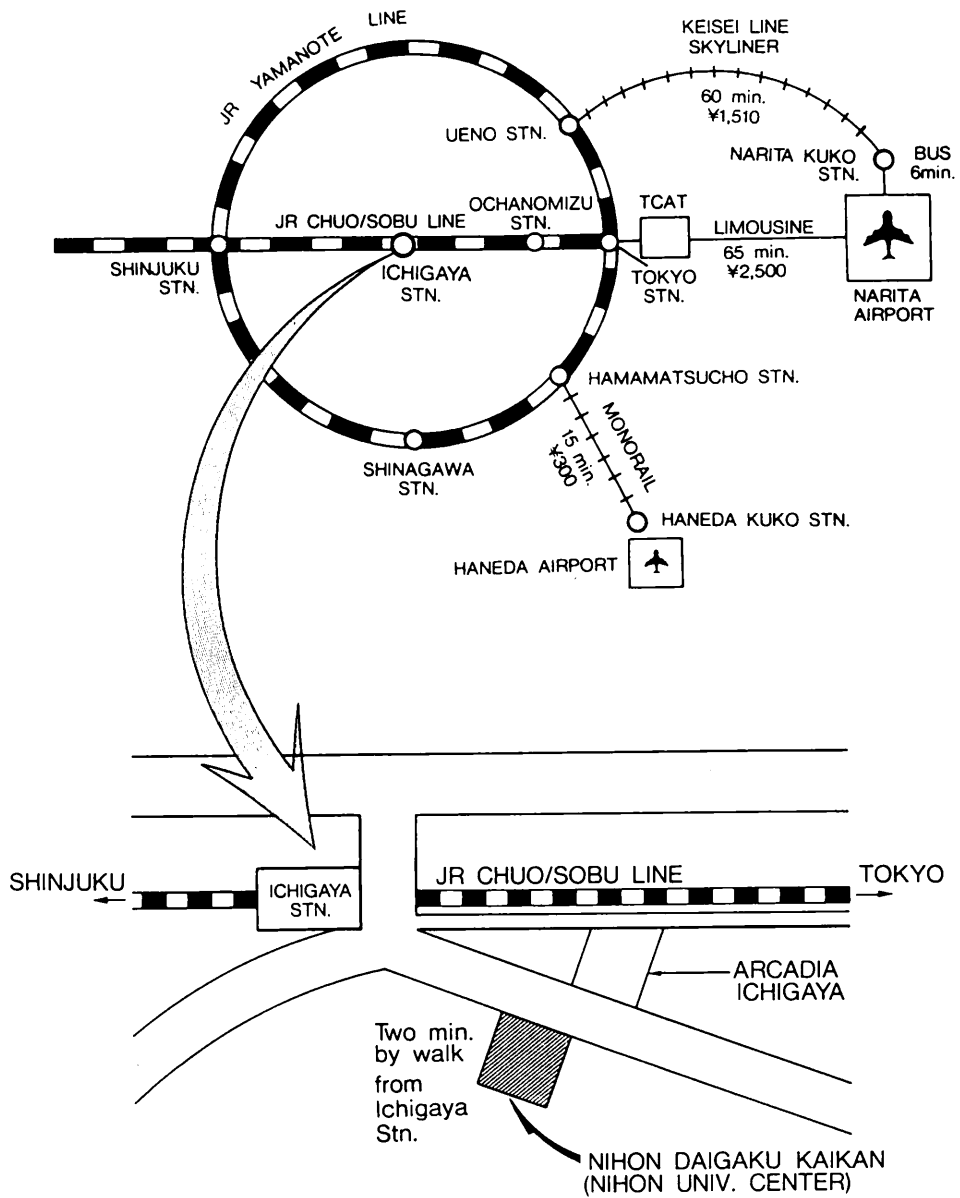
ACCESS TO DOWNTOWN TOKYO

Most international flights arrive at New Tokyo International Airport (Narita), about 41 miles (66 km) away from central Tokyo.

The most recommendable way to reach your hotel is to take the Airport Limousine Bus which departs from the airport arrival lobbies directly to Hotel Grand Palace. Please take a taxi from Hotel Grand Palace to other hotels.

If above buses are not available, it is suggested that participants take the bus bound for Tokyo City Air Terminal (TCAT) or Tokyo Station. These buses depart at the intervals of every 10 - 30 minutes, depending on the time of the day, connecting with all international flights from the first in the morning to the last in the evening. Running time, approximately 70 - 90 minutes (Fare ¥2,500 - ¥2,600). Participants are advised to take a taxi to their hotel from the Terminal or Station (fare ¥1,500 - ¥2,000 approximately).

International Medical Course

Diagnostic oral pathology

23 July - 3 August 1990, Sheffield

The aim of this course is to provide participants with the opportunity for discussion and guidance on difficult problems encountered in the microscopic diagnosis of pathological conditions associated with the tissues in and adjacent to the mouth. Much of the course will involve the study of prepared specimens with the light microscope; some of the latter will be circulated prior to the start of the course and participants will also be given the opportunity to discuss a limited number of their own cases.

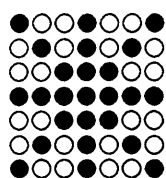
The Director of Studies will be Professor Colin Smith, Professor of Oral Pathology at the University of Sheffield Health Authority and Honorary Consultant Oral Pathologist at the Charles Clifford Dental Hospital in Sheffield. The course will be held at the Medical and Dental Schools of the University of Sheffield.

The course is directed mainly towards academic and hospital dentists involved in oral pathology and towards general pathologists with a special interest or responsibility in this field.

There are vacancies for 30 participants.

Course fee: £770; accommodation fee: £220; total fee: £990.

Resident participants will be accommodated at Earnshaw Hall, part of the University of Sheffield.
